CALL TO ORDER: A regular meeting was held at the Kentucky Board of Pharmacy at the Board Office at 125 Holmes Street, State Office Building Annex, Ste. 300, Frankfort, Kentucky. President Thornbury called the Meeting to order at 9:08 a.m.

Guests: Chris Killmeier, Walgreens; Adam Parrish, Walmart; Anne Policastri, KSHP; Robert McFalls, Chris Clifton, KPhA; Jan Gould and Shannon Stiglitz, Kentucky Retail Federation; Ralph Bouvette, APSC; Lindsay Collett, and Caitlin Sinclair, College of Pharmacy students.

MINUTES: On motion by Mr. Hadley, seconded by Dr. Hanna and passed unanimously, the Minutes of October 22-23, 2015 Board Meeting and Retreat were approved.

INTERAGENCY: Comments regarding the CDC draft of opioid prescribing guidelines should be forwarded to Executive Director quickly for compilation for the next board meeting.

BOARD REPORTS:

Board Executive Director. 1) eMARS Reports for September 2015, October 2015, and November 2015 and the Financial Report were presented to the Board. 2) Dr. Hanna moved to allow Steve Hart, Executive Director and up to 3 board members to attend the National Prescription Drug Abuse Summit in Atlanta, GA, March 28-31, 2016. Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

CURRENT/PENDING CASES:

Board Counsel: Cheryl Lalonde stated that she had been working on unresolved disciplinary cases, participating in 13B prehearing conferences, and scheduling administrative conferences with staff to resolve numerous pending cases.

Case Updates: Dr. Greenwell moved to accept Case Updates for Case Numbers 10-0039A, 12-0175, 14-0020, 14-0447, 15-0048C, 15-0082B, 15-0093, 15-0242, 15-0259B, 15-0259C, 15-0281, 15-0291, 15-0300, 15-0301, 15-0303, 15-0306B, 15-0307A, 15-0307B, 15-0309A, 15-0310A, 15-0310B, 15-0311A, 15-0312A, 15-0312B, 15-0313A, 15-314A, 15-315A, 15-0316A, 15-0317A, 15-0317B, 15-0319. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Dr.

Greenwell would like additional details in case summaries, including the status of other charged companion parties.

Case Review: Dr. Greenwell moved to accept Case Review recommendations, except for Case No. 15-0299. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Case No. 11-0264A. Revisit. Confidentiality violation. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 13-0011B Revisit. Medication error agreed order contested; records no longer available. Alleged violation of law: KRS 217.065. CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 14-0019. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without having first received a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121 (2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence developed and the investigator is directed to conduct further investigation.

Case No. 14-0265. Pharmacist was allegedly short 2 hours of CE in 2013. New Information: Pharmacist signed Agreed Order and paid fine. Pharmacist recently found documented proof of the CE deficiency. Pharmacist is requesting expungement of the agreed order. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:015, Section 5. CRC Recommendation: Case is dismissed.

Case No. 14-0449 Revisit. Non Resident permit holder shipped prescriptions into the Commonwealth prior to obtaining a permit in December 2013. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.0351(1). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0035A and 15-0258A Revisit. Pharmacy failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs in both cases. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:100, Section 1. CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0254. A facility was allegedly located in a residence. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:105 Section 5(1)(c)2. CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient

evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0257A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by allowing the dispensing of hydralazine, Lisinopril and furosemide to a patient for whom it was not prescribed. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence developed and the investigator is directed to conduct further investigation.

Case No. 15-0257B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error by dispensing hydralazine, Lisinopril and furosemide to a patient for whom it was not prescribed. Alleged Violation of Law: (B) KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence developed and the investigator is directed to conduct further investigation.

Case No. 15-0286. Registered pharmacy technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct. Technician violated an Agreed Order by failing to adhere to the terms and conditions as provided in the Agreed Order. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0289. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate safeguards against improper manipulation or alteration of the data in a computerized recordkeeping system. Alleged violations of law: 201 KAR 2:170, Section 1(6). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0292A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 86 alprazolam 0.5 mg tablets, a loss of 55 alprazolam 2 mg tablets, a loss of 125 alprazolam 1 mg tablets, a loss of 30 alprazolam 2mg tablets, a loss of 99 dextroamphetamine 10 mg tablets, a loss of 30 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10mg tablets, a loss of 727 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10 mg tablets, a loss of 53 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10 mg tablets, and a loss of 243 filmtabs of suboxone 8mg-2mg film tablets over approximately 16 months (5-1-2014 to 8-25-2015). Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:100, Section 1. CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed

Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No 15-0292B. Pharmacist in charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 86 alprazolam 0.5 mg tablets, a loss of 55 alprazolam 2 mg tablets, a loss of 125 alprazolam 1 mg tablets, a loss of 30 alprazolam, 2mg tablets, a loss of 99 dextroamphetamine 10 mg tablets, a loss of 30 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10mg tablets, a loss of 727 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10 mg tablets, a loss of 53 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10 mg tablets, and a loss of 243 filmtabs of suboxone 8mg-2mg film tablets over approximately 16 months (5-1-2014 to 8-25-2015). The pharmacist in charge assumed this position in February 2015. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:205, Section 2(3)(b). **CRC Recommendation:** There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0292C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(f). **CRC Recommendation:** There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0292D. Pharmacist in charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 86 alprazolam 0.5 mg tablets, a loss of 55 alprazolam 2 mg tablets, a loss of 125 alprazolam 1 mg tablets, a loss of 30 alprazolam 2mg tablets, a loss of 99 dextroamphetamine 10 mg tablets, a loss of 30 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10mg tablets, a loss of 727 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10 mg tablets, a loss of 53 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 10 mg tablets, and a loss of 243 filmtabs of suboxone 8mg-2mg film tablets over approximately 16 months (5-1-2014 to 8-25-2015). The pharmacist in charge assumed this position in February 2015. Case No. 15-0298A Revisit. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 63 Vyvanse capsules over a period of three months. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:100, Section 1. **CRC Recommendation:** There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed

Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0298B Revisit. Pharmacist in charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 63 Vyvanse capsules over a period of three months. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:205, Section 2(3)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0298C Revisit. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0302A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by allowing a registered technician to perform a professional act in the practice of pharmacy. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0302B. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by allowing a registered technician to perform a professional act in the practice of pharmacy. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0302C. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by allowing a registered technician to perform a professional act in the practice of pharmacy. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0304A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to maintain a patient record that enabled the pharmacist to determine the impact of previously dispensed drugs and known disease conditions upon the newly submitted prescriptive drug order. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:210, Section 1(d)(3). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0304B. Pharmacist allegedly failed to offer to counsel a patient upon the presentation of an original prescription order. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:210,

Section 2(1)(a). **CRC Recommendation:** There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0308A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly aided and abetted an employee to assist in the practice of pharmacy without having a current pharmacy technician registration. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(g). **CRC Recommendation:** There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0318. Registered Pharmacy Technician entered a plea of guilty and was convicted of a Class D felony. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(c). **CRC Recommendation:** There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0321A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly sold a misbranded drug due to medication error. The physician prescribed hydrocodone/acetaminophen 5/325 and acetaminophen 500 mg was dispensed to the patient. Alleged violation of law: KRS 217.065(1). **CRC Recommendation:** There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0321B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error. Physician prescribed hydrocodone/acetaminophen 5/325, but acetaminophen 500 mg was dispensed to patient. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121 (2)(d). **CRC Recommendation:** There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0322A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly sold a misbranded drug due to a medication error. The doctor wrote a prescription for potassium chloride 10 mEq capsule to take 20 mEq by mouth two times a day with meal. A prescription was filled for potassium chloride extended release 10 mEq capsules. The directions on the prescription label read take 1 capsule by mouth twice a day with food. Alleged violation of law: KRS 217.065(1). **CRC Recommendation:** There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0322B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error. The doctor wrote a prescription for potassium chloride 10 mEq capsule to take 20 mEq by mouth two times a day with meal. A prescription was filled for potassium chloride extended release 10 mEq capsules. The directions on the prescription label read take 1 capsule by mouth twice a day with food. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0324A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly sold a misbranded drug due to medication error. A prescription was written for Percocet 7.5mg/325mg but hydrocodone/apap 7.5mg/325mg was dispensed. Alleged violation of law: KRS 217.065(1). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0324B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error. A prescription was written for Percocet 7.5mg/325 mg but hydrocodone/apap 7.5mg/325 mg was dispensed. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0325. A pharmacy technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case 15-0326A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to maintain a patient record that enabled the pharmacist to determine the impact of previously dispensed drugs and known disease conditions upon the newly submitted prescriptive drug order. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:210, Section 1(d)(3). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case 15-0326B. Pharmacist allegedly failed to perform a proper prospective drug use review prior to dispensing a prescription. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:210, Section 4(1). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0327A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of pharmacy. An employee was permitted within pharmacy when a pharmacist was not present. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:100(1). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0327B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in conduct which substantially departs from accepted standards of pharmacy practice ordinarily exercised by a pharmacist. An employee was permitted within pharmacy when a pharmacist was not present. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:100(1) and 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0328A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by allowing a wrong medication to be dispensed to a patient and allowing a second medication to be dispensed to the wrong patient. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0328B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by divulging to unauthorized persons patient information without the patient's express consent or without order or direction of the court and by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public by dispensing a wrong medication and allowing a second medication to be dispensed to the wrong patient. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(b), KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0328C. Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by allowing medication to go to the wrong patient and divulging to unauthorized persons patient information without the patient's express consent or without order or direction of the court and by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0329A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly sold a misbranded drug due to medication error. Patient was prescribed doxycycline but was dispensed doxepin. Alleged violation of law: KRS 217.065(1). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0329B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error. Patient was prescribed doxycycline but was dispensed doxepin. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0330. Wholesale Distributor allegedly failed to notify the Board fifteen days prior to closure. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:106, Section 2(1)(c). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0331A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 312 tramadol 50mg tablets, 1873 alprazolam 1mg tablets, phentermine 37.5mg tablets, and 139 zolpidem 10mg tablets over a period of approximately 4.5 months. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:100, Section 1. CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0331B. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 312 tramadol 50mg tablets, 1873 alprazolam 1mg tablets, phentermine 37.5mg tablets, and 139 zolpidem 10mg tablets over a period of approximately 4.5 months. Alleged violation of law: 201 KAR 2:205, Section 2(3)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to

warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0331C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0332A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct. Patient requested administration of pneumonia vaccine and was administered tetanus vaccine. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0332B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by administering tetanus vaccine instead of pneumonia vaccine. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0334. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional and unethical conduct by violating an Agreed Order, in which a drug test was failed due to alcohol consumption. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0335A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to maintain a patient record that enabled the pharmacist to determine the impact of previously dispensed drugs and known disease conditions upon the newly submitted prescriptive drug order. Alleged Violations of Law: 201 KAR 2:210, Section 1(d)(3). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if

unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0335B. Pharmacist allegedly failed to perform a proper prospective drug use review prior to dispensing a prescription. Alleged Violations of Law: 201 KAR 2:210, Section 4(1). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0335C. Pharmacist allegedly failed to perform a proper prospective drug use review prior to dispensing a prescription. Alleged Violations of Law: 201 KAR 2:210, Section 4(1) CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0335D. Pharmacist allegedly failed to perform a proper prospective drug use review prior to dispensing a prescription. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:210, Section 4(1). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0336. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to place a pharmacist in charge of pharmacy from September 21, 2015 to November 18, 2015. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.020(1). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0337A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by employing a pharmacist who divulged patient information to an unauthorized individual. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0337B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by divulging patient information to an unauthorized individual. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0339. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without having first received a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0340A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly aided or abetted an employee to assist in the practice of pharmacy with having a current pharmacy technician registration. Dr. Greenwell recused himself. Dr. Hanna moved to accept Case No. 15-0299. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Case No. 15-0299 Revisit. Pharmacist intern arrested in Louisville KY on or about July 29, 2015, and failed to report to the Board within 30 days. Furthermore, is not currently enrolled in pharmacy school, an applicant for licensure, or awaiting exam results. Alleged violation of law: KRS 315.121(1)(a)(h) and (4); 201 KAR 2:040, Section 4(4)(a); and Section 5. CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Pharmacy Technician Registrant AS. Dr. Hanna moved to approve the application for pharmacy technician registration for AS provided he signs an Agreed Order with standard Kentucky PRN language that includes 3 years probation and up to 3 drug screens per year. Dr. Greenwell seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Pharmacy Technician Registrant JF. Dr. Greenwell moved to deny the application for pharmacy technician registration for JF. JF failed to provide information regarding a second DUI as requested. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Pharmacy Technician Registrant AB. Dr. Greenwell moved to approve the application for pharmacy technician registration for AB provided he signs an Agreed Order with standard Kentucky PRN language that includes one year probation. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Equipment Exemption/Capital Pharmacy. Aaron McIntosh, owner of Capital Pharmacy requested an exemption for reference materials and prescription equipment for a new permit for a closed door pharmacy. It is connected to an existing permitted pharmacy. Dr. Hanna moved to grant Capital Pharmacy's request for an exemption for reference materials and prescription equipment for Capital Pharmacy. Dr. Greenwell seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Grant County Drugs North off site storage request. Dr. Greenwell moved to allow Grant County Drugs North to store prescription records offsite, as long as they are retrievable in 48 hours if requested. Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Eugenia Arms requested amendment of Agreed Order to be PIC. Dr. Hanna rescued herself. Dr. Greenwell moved to deny Eugenia Arms' request to serve as a PIC. Eugenia Arms signed an Agreed Order executed on 6/4/2003 that places her on probation for 25 years. Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Equipment Exemption/TJ Samson Pavilion Oncology Pharmacy. Krista Ross of TJ Samson Pavilion Oncology Pharmacy requested an exemption to pharmacy equipment. There will be no compounding performed at this location. Dr. Greenwell moved to grant TJ Samson Pavilion Oncology Pharmacy's request for an exemption for pharmacy equipment as long as no compounding is performed, however, if compounding is performed, equipment must be obtained. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

201 KAR 2:370 Pharmacy Services in Long Term Care Facility. Dr. Hanna moved to approve 201 KAR 2:370 as submitted and file by January 15, 2015. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Hanna moved to set the hearing date at 9 a.m. for 201 KAR 2:370 on February 24, 2015, at the Board office. Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

KRS 315.522. Reciprocity with bordering states. Mr. Hadley moved to repeal the statute. Dr. Greenwell seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

KRS 315.136. Requirements for registration as pharmacy technician. Dr. Greenwell moved to amend the statute to require background checks for technicians. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

KRS 315.150 Board Membership-Appointment-Term-Vacancy-Oath-Quorum; KRS 315.400 Definitions; Medical Gas Wholesaler; In-State Outsourcing Facility; Out-of-State Outsourcing Facility were presented as drafts. The Board will share with stakeholders and accept comments before the January 13, 2016 Board Meeting.

Dr. Greenwell moved to approve continuing education programs 15-54 through 15-57 as recommended. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

Sterile Compounding Task Force Update. The task force met on November 19, December 3 and 17; it consisted of 13 people with approximately 30-40 attending each meeting. The recommendations are a best practice statement and a grading system, which was not a focus; instead an exit summary was created. Ms. Brewer moved to approve the Task's Force Best Practice Statement for a Compound Record, Dr. Greenwell seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Hanna moved to approve the Summary of Sterile Compounding Inspection form as presented. Mr. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS:

Election of Officers. Dr. DeWire nominated Mr. Thornbury for President; there were no other nominations. Dr. Hanna moved to close nominations, Mr. Hadley seconded, and motion passed unanimously. Mr. Thornbury was elected by acclamation.

Mr. Thornbury nominated Dr. DeWire for Vice President. Ms. Brewer seconded, and there were no other nominations. Mr. Thornbury moved to close nominations, Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Dr. DeWire was elected by acclamation.

Advisory Council Appointments. Dr. Greenwell moved to appoint Marcus Franklin to the Advisory Council, Dr. Hanna seconded. In discussion it was determined that Mr. Franklin was not qualified to serve. Dr. Greenwell amended his motion to appoint Elizabeth Scott to a 4 year term to the Advisory Council, Dr. Hanna amended her second and the motion passed unanimously.

FYI:

Katie Busroe has been hired as the new Pharmacy Inspections and Investigations Supervisor. Caleb Benningfield has resigned as Pharmacy and Drug Inspector

ADJOURNMENT: On motion by Dr. Greenwell, seconded by Dr. DeWire and passed unanimously, President Thornbury adjourned the Board Meeting at 11:40 a.m. The next regularly scheduled Board Meeting is at 9:00 a.m. on January 13, 2016 at the Board Office in Frankfort, Kentucky.
