CALL TO ORDER: A regular meeting was held at the Kentucky Board of Pharmacy at the Board Office at 125 Holmes Street, State Office Building Annex, Ste. 300, Frankfort, Kentucky. President Thornbury called the Meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

Members present: Joel Thornbury, Deborah Brewer, Brian DeWire, Scott Greenwell, Larry Hadley and Cathy Hanna. Staff: Michael Burleson, Executive Director; Steve Hart, Pharmacy Inspections and Investigations Coordinator; Shannon Allen, Christina Amburgey, Caleb Benningfield, Katie Busroe, and Amanda Harding, Pharmacy and Drug Inspectors; Cheryl Lalonde, Assistant Attorney General and Board Counsel; Brian Fingerson, Pharmacist Recovery Network Committee; and Lisa Atha, Executive Secretary. Guests: Chris Killmeier, Walgreens; Ralph Bouvette, APSC; Anne Policastri, KSHP; Robert McFalls, KPhA; Jan Gould, Kentucky Retail Federation; Ryan Haggard, University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy; Lauren Willis, Sullivan University College of Pharmacy; Jacob Beck; and Briana J. Kocher. Melody Curtis, Court Reporter, recorded the meeting.

MINUTES: On motion by Dr. DeWire, seconded by Mr. Hadley and passed unanimously, the Minutes of March 11, 2015 and April 15, 2015 were approved.

APPEARANCES:

James Arnett. Mr. Arnett was sworn in by Melody Curtis, Court Reporter. Mr. Arnett was appearing before the Board to request reinstatement of his Kentucky pharmacist's license. Mr. Arnett gave a brief overview of the events that led to the loss of his pharmacist's license. Mr. Arnett was licensed as a pharmacist in Kentucky in 1992. He began using pain medication legitimately as the result of a car accident. But, in 2010 he began to abuse the medication. Around 2013, Mr. Arnett realized he had a problem and tried to make changes, one of which was moving to Indiana. He moved back to Kentucky at the end of 2013. On March 21, 2014, he was caught diverting controlled substances on camera, was terminated from his place of employment and arrested. He surrendered his Kentucky pharmacist's license to the Board on March 24, 2014. At this time he started AA/NA meetings but did not go directly to residential treatment. On May 22, 2014, he entered Questhouse. Mr. Arnett signed the KYPRN on June 24, 2014 and the Agreed Order was finalized on November 7, 2014. Mr. Arnett's sobriety date is May 19, 2014.

After discussion, Ms. Brewer moved to go into Executive Session pursuant to KRS 61.810(1)(c)(j) to discuss proposed or pending litigation and individual adjudications with Ms. Lalonde, Mr. Burleson, Mr. Hart and Dr. Harding in attendance. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Dr. De Wire moved to come out of Executive Session. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Greenwell moved to reinstate James Arnett's Kentucky pharmacist's license with stipulations as follows: probation for 5 years; shall maintain a perpetual inventory at all places of employment for Schedule II drugs, with electronic tracking of Schedule III-V drugs and expired controlled substances, perpetual inventory shall be made available to the Board upon request and audits may be conducted; shall attend AA/NA meetings no less than 6 times per 2 week period or 12 meetings per calendar month, which shall include a minimum of 2 meetings per week; Board shall conduct quarterly inspections at all locations of employment or practice as a pharmacist for the first two years of probation, then semi-annually for the next 3 years, the cost of which not to exceed \$500 per inspection, shall be paid to the Board within 30 days of invoicing; continuing education requirements must be satisfied, renewal fees and any penalties must be paid, and a complete renewal application must be submitted; maximum hours of work: 45 hours/week or 90 hours/2 weeks, with a maximum of 50 hours in any 7 consecutive days and no overtime; shall provide a copy of this Agreed Order to all employers and pharmacists-in-charge; shall sign an aftercare contract, to include drug counselor if indicated, with the Pharmacist Recovery Network Committee (PRNC) for the length of the Agreed Order; any violation of this Agreed Order or PRN contract shall be reported to the Board and PRNC Chair within 24 hours of violation; shall notify Board of change of home address, telephone number, and/or email within 7 days of change; shall provide to the Board and PRNC a signed release granting the Board and PRNC access to all written medical records and conversations regarding medical care; shall provide the Board and PRNC with written monthly reports of all AA/NA meetings; shall agree to provide observed urine, other body fluid, or hair samples for drug/alcohol screens at the direction of PRNC, the Board or any other monitoring body; provide copies of any results of any screens ordered to the Board and PRNC; provide notification to PRNC Chair, Board and testing company of anything that may affect pharmacist's availability for screens prior to event, a missed screen shall be cause for reporting such to the Board, any positive screen that is a violation of the Agreed Order or PRN contract shall be communicated to the Board by the PRNC Chair within 24 hours, a report indicating a presumptive presence shall constitute a conclusive basis, without the necessity of a hearing, for a determination that pharmacist is not in compliance with the terms of this Agreed Order of Reinstatement; shall agree to abstain from any and all mood-altering chemicals, except as prescribed by pharmacist's physician and only after consultation with PRNC Chair; shall notify PRNC Chair in advance if any mood-altering and/or potentially addictive medications are required or recommended by pharmacist's physician; shall provide documentation to PRNC Chair of the need for the medication within 3 days; shall renew verification with PRNC Chair every 90 days if need for medication is ongoing; shall give up the right to self-medicate with the exception of single entity OTC NSAIDS and acetaminophen; shall be excluded from accepting a position of pharmacist-in-charge, power of attorney, or preceptor; shall advise Board at all times of place of employment and shall only practice at a location with a work schedule that has received prior approval of the Board or its President; shall obtain all prescriptions and those of family at a pharmacy designated in writing to the Board; prescriptions shall not be filled by a family member or at any family owned pharmacy and shall not dispense any drugs for self or family; shall attend within 1 year of entry of this Agreed Order either the University of Utah School on Alcoholism and other Drug Dependencies, CAPTASA, or SE PRN meeting and shall provide a certificate of completion; shall provide monthly written self-performance evaluations to the Board and PRNC Chair and shall make all appearances before the PRNC as requested, including an annual appearance 3 closest to the anniversary date of

reinstatement; shall not work at a pharmacy owned, in whole or in part, by him or another member of his family and shall not possess a key to a pharmacy owned, in whole or in part, by him or another member of his family; shall not be on the premises of any pharmacy owned, in whole or in part, by him or another member of his family; during probation shall have prior approval to own a new pharmacy, in whole or in part, by the Board or Board President; committing any act that results in violation of federal or state pharmacy or drug statute or regulation, may result in an emergency suspension of pharmacist's license, require an appearance before the Board, or result in a complaint against pharmacist's license with the Board imposing any applicable penalties; any violation of the Agreed Order of Reinstatement shall cause him to automatically lose his license to practice pharmacy for not less than five years and one day and shall require individual to petition the Board for reinstatement only after he has taken and successfully passed the entire Kentucky Board of Pharmacy licensure examination; and shall not seek to amend or modify this Agreed Order. Above information shall be reported to NABP and is subject to disclosure under the Kentucky Open Records Act. Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed 4 to 1 with Dr. Greenwell, Mr. Hadley, Ms. Brewer and Dr. Hanna voting for the motion and Dr. DeWire voting against the motion.

INTERAGENCY: Bob Oakley, President of KPhA, announced the Annual KPhA Meeting will be held in Bowling Green, Kentucky, June 25 – 28, 2015.

Anne Policastri, Executive Director of KSHP, thanked Mike Burleson and Steve Hart for attending the KSHP Spring Meeting, May 8, 2015. There were 197 attendees.

BOARD REPORTS:

Board Executive Director. 1) eMARS Reports for February 2015 and March 2015 and the Financial Report were presented to the Board. 2) Dr. Hanna moved to change the November Board Meeting and Retreat to October 23 -24, 2015, at the Seelbach Hotel in Louisville to coincide with MALTAGON, which Kentucky is hosting. Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. This is now a Special Called Board Meeting. 3) Mr. Hadley moved to approve all Board Members and the Executive Director to attend NABP/AACP District III Meeting, August 14-18, 2015, in St. Augustine, Florida. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. 4) Dr. Greenwell moved to allow Steve Hart and the Pharmacy Inspections and Investigations Coordinator to attend the CLEAR Conference, September 17-19, 2015, in Boston, using Federal Funds. Mr. Hart will be running for President-elect. Mr. Hadley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. 5) Dr. Greenwell moved to allow 2 members of the PRN Committee to attend the APhA Institute on Alcoholism and Drug Dependencies, June 5-8, 2015, in Salt Lake City, Utah. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. 6) The Governor's final signature was received naming Steve Hart as the Executive Director. Mr. Hart will start the transition and new salary on May 16, 2015.

Case Updates: Dr. Greenwell moved to accept Case Updates for Case Numbers 08-0064B; 14-0066; 14-0323; 14-0335; 14-0354; 14-0373; 14-0386; 14-0417; 14-0426B; 14-0428; 14-0434C; 14-0443B; 14-0448C; 14-0451; and 15-0054. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Case Review: Dr. Hanna moved to accept Case Review recommendations with corrections. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Case No. 14-0247C Revisit. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by diverting controlled substances. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 14-0317B Revisit. Pharmacist-in-charge did not provide adequate security by allowing a pharmacy technician to enter the pharmacy on one occasion without there being a pharmacist on the premises. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205 Section 2 (3)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 14-0381B Revisit. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. The pharmacy reported a loss of approximately 14,500 tablets of various controlled substances attributed to technician diversion. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205 Section 2 (3)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 14-0398B Revisit. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public by dispensing a refill to a patient which had the directions to take one tablet once a day instead of the directions to take one tablet twice a day. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 14-0435A Revisit. Pharmacy permit holder was found closed during a routine inspection and there was no pharmacist present during the scheduled hours of operation for the day. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:106 Section 2 (2)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 14-0435B Revisit. Pharmacist was not present during the scheduled hours of operation for the day. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:106 Section 2 (2)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0005. Technician allegedly falsified original application for registration by failing to inform the Board of an alcohol conviction. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (1)(e). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0046A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct on three different occasions. The physician prescribed fentanyl patch 50mcg/hr and fentanyl patch 75mcg/hr was dispensed to a patient; the physician prescribed fentanyl patch 50mcg/hr and fentanyl patch 75mcg/hr was dispensed to a patient; and the physician prescribed oxycodone 30mg tablets, take ½ -1 tablet four times a day and oxycodone 30mg tablets, take ½ to 1 tablet twice a day was dispense to a patient. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(1)(a). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0046B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error. Physician prescribed fentanyl patch 50mcg/hr and fentanyl patch 75mcg/hr was dispensed to a patient. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0046C. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error. Physician prescribed fentanyl patch 50mcg/hr and fentanyl patch 75mcg/hr was dispensed to a patient. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0046D. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by committing a medication error. Physician prescribed oxycodone 30mg tablets, take ½ - 1 tablet four times a day and oxycodone 30mg tablets, take ½ to 1 tablet twice a day were dispensed to a patient. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(2)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0047A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly had not reported to the Board that a pharmacy technician had forged a prescription. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (1)(d). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0047B. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct in attempt to selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly forged a prescription. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0048 A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 556 buprenorphine 8mg tablets over a period of 1 month. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:100 Section 1. CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0048 B. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 556 buprenorphine 8mg tablets over a period of 1 month. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205 Section 2 (3)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0048 C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first

receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly diverted 556 buprenorphine 8mg tablets. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0049. Pharmacist allegedly has a mental or physical incapacity that prevents licensee from engaging in the practice of pharmacy with reasonable skill, competence, and safety to the public. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (1)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence developed and the investigator is directed to conduct further investigation

Case No. 15-0050 A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 4033 alprazolam 1mg over a period of 1 month. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:100 Section 1. CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0050 B. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 4033 alprazolam 1mg over a period of 1 month. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205 Section 2 (3)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0050 C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly diverted 4033 alprazolam 1mg over a period of 1 month. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0055 A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 3,515 alprazolam and 831 clonazepam over approximately a 3 month period. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:100 Section 1. CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No. 15-0055 B. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 3,515 alprazolam and 831 clonazepam over

approximately a 3 month period. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205 Section 2 (3)(b). CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case No.15-0055C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly diverted 3,515 alprazolam and 831 clonazepam over approximately a 3 month period. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2)(f). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0056A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly sold a misbranded drug due to medication error. Patient received the correct medication, cetirizine syrup, but the wrong patient's label. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to keep accurate dispensing records. Alleged Violations of Law: KRS 217.065(1) and 201 KAR 2:170 Section 1(2). CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing.

Case No. 15-0056B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury and divulging or revealing to unauthorized persons patient information without the patient's express consent due to a medication error. Patient received the correct medication, cetirizine syrup, but the wrong patient's label. Alleged Violations of Law: KRS 315.121(2)(b) and (d). Pharmacy Technician Registrant JW. Dr. Greenwell moved to approve the initial application for pharmacy technician registration for JW provided he signs an Agreed Order with standard Kentucky PRN language that includes 2 years probation and up to 3 drug screens per year. Dr. DeWire seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Pharmacy Technician Registrant AM. Dr. Greenwell moved to deny the initial application for pharmacy technician registration for AM. Dr. DeWire seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Pharmacy Technician Registrant AB. Dr. Greenwell moved to approve the initial application for pharmacy technician registration for AB provided he signs an Agreed Order with standard Kentucky PRN language that includes 2 years probation and up to 3 drug screens per year. Dr. DeWire seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Greenwell moved to approve the renewal applications for pharmacy technician registration for HE, MT, JK, ER and AS provided they each sign an Agreed Order with standard Kentucky PRN language that includes 1 year probation. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Richard Magliano/Reciprocity Request. Richard Magliano requested to reciprocate his pharmacist's license from Ohio to Kentucky. Mr. Magliano would not be living or working in Kentucky but would be the Kentucky licensed pharmacist-in-charge for an out of state pharmacy located in Ohio. In 2005, the Ohio Board of Pharmacy suspended Mr. Magliano's pharmacist's license due to impairment. He was charged with 3 counts of diversion for which he received treatment in lieu of conviction. His pharmacist's license was suspended for one year. His sobriety date is November 15, 2005. He completed an inpatient residential treatment program and signed a contract with the Ohio Pharmacist Recovery Organization. The Ohio Board of Pharmacy reinstated Mr. Magliano's pharmacist's license December 1, 2007 and placed him on 5 years probation. The probation was completed March 21, 2012. Mr. Magliano's Ohio pharmacist's license is currently in good standing. Dr. Greenwell moved to grant Richard Magliano's request to reciprocate his Ohio pharmacist's license to Kentucky. Dr. DeWire seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Vanessa Duran/Pharmacist Intern Reporting. Vanessa Duran was sworn-in by Melanie Curtis, Court Reporter. Ms. Duran is a student at Sullivan University College of Pharmacy and a registered intern with the Kentucky Board of Pharmacy. In 2011, Ms. Duran plead guilty to a felony conviction to a 2010 charge of Aggravated Battery. Ms. Duran notified Sullivan University College of Pharmacy and her pharmacy employer of the conviction but failed to notify the Kentucky Board of Pharmacy. Ms. Duran explained the situation and stated it was negligent oversight and not malicious intention to not inform the Board. Dr. Greenwell moved to allow Vanessa Duran to retain her Kentucky Intern Registration and issue a Letter of Reprimand for not completing the intern application correctly with 2 years probation, until graduation, and if Ms. Duran commits any violation she must appear before the Board of Pharmacy. Dr. DeWire seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Bryce Nowack/Pharmacist Intern Reporting. Bryce Nowack is in his second year at Sullivan University College of Pharmacy. On December 31, 2014, Mr. Nowack was charged with Driving Under the Influence which was amended to Alcohol Intoxication. Dr. Greenwell moved to allow Bryce Nowack to retain his Kentucky Intern Registration provided he signs a Kentucky PRN Agreement with standard language including 1 year probation. Dr. DeWire seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE/COMMUNICATION:

Continuing Education Waiver/Chris Parrino. Chris Parrino requested a waiver for 2014 continuing education requirements due to a medical issue. Dr. Greenwell moved to deny Chris Parrino's request for a 2014 continuing education waiver and treat as a self reported continuing education violation with a \$250 fine and double the continuing education hours not obtained in 2014. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
