CALL TO ORDER A regular meeting was held at Sullivan University College of Pharmacy, Louisville, Kentucky. President Greenwell called the meeting to order on March 8, 2017 at 9:02 a.m. He welcomed the students, thanked Sullivan University College of Pharmacy for hosting and explained the makeup and function of the Board. INTERAGENCY

Case Update. Dr. Hanna moved to accept Case Updates for Case Numbers 14-0371B, 16-0438A and 16-0438D. Mr. Poole seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Case Review. Dr. Dewire moved to accept Case Review recommendations:

Case 16-0072 Revisit. Out of state pharmacy was allegedly convicted of a violation of pharmacy or drug laws, rules or administrative regulations of another state. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(1)(c)3.

CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case 16-0073 Revisit. Out of state pharmacy was allegedly convicted of a violation of pharmacy or drug laws, rules or administrative regulations of another state. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(1)(c)3.

CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case 16-0074 Revisit. Out of state pharmacy was allegedly convicted of a violation of pharmacy or drug laws, rules or administrative regulations of another state. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(1)(c)3.

CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case 16-0076 Revisit. Out of state pharmacy was allegedly convicted of a violation of pharmacy or drug laws, rules or administrative regulations of another state. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(1)(c)3.

CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case 16-0440 A. Revisit. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 212 Hydrocodone/Apap 10-325mg over a period of 2 months, 101 Oxycodone/Apap 7.5/325mg over a period of 3 months, 254 Oxycodone/Apap 10mg/325mg over a period of 1 month. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:100 Section 1. **CRC**

Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case 16-0440 B. Revisit. Pharmacist-in-Charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 212 Hydrocodone/Apap 10-325mg over a period of 2 months, 101 Oxycodone/Apap 7.5/325mg over a period of 3 months, 254 Oxycodone/Apap 10mg/325mg over a period of 1 month. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205 Section 2 (3) (b). **CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.**

Case 16-0440 C. Revisit. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2) (f). **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and revocation.**

Case 16-0516 A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of controlled substances. A bottle of oxycodone 15 mg tablets count of 100 went missing on or about October 27, 2016. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to maintain accurate controlled substance inventory records. Alleged Violations of Law: 201 KAR 2:100 Section 1, KRS 218A.200(7)a, and KRS 315.121(1)(h). **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and \$5000 administrative fine, inspections after CII audit with PIC present, CII audits after 6 months, one year probation with approved CS record security, monthly reconciled perpetual inventory on all CS for one year.**

Case 16-0516 B. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security of controlled substances for the disappearance of a bottle of oxycodone 15 mg tablets count of 100. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205 Section 2(3)b. **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and \$500 administrative fine, additional 6 hours of continuing education on pharmacy law.**

Case 16-0516 C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly ingested controlled substances for which prescription drug orders are required, without having first received prescription drug orders for the

drugs. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(2)f. **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence developed and the investigator is directed to conduct further investigation.**

Case 16-0521 A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 611 dosage units, primarily alprazolam, over an audit period of five months. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:100 Section 1. **CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.**

Case 16-0521 B. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 611 dosage units, primarily alprazolam, over an audit period of five months. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205. Section 2. (3) (b). **CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.**

Case 16-0521 C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2) (f). **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and revocation.**

Case 16-0522 A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 377 dosage units of various medications over an audit period of six months. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:100 Section 1. **CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.**

Case 16-0522 B. Pharmacist-in-charge allegedly failed to provide adequate security and control of drugs. Pharmacy reported a loss of 377 dosage units of various medications over an audit period of six months. Alleged Violation of Law: 201 KAR 2:205. Section 2. (3) (b). **CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.**

Case 16-0522 C. Registered Pharmacy Technician allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by selling, transferring, dispensing, ingesting, or administering a drug for which a prescription drug order is required, without first receiving a prescription drug order for the drug. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2) (f). **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is**

directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and revocation.

Case 16-0523 A. Pharmacy permit holder allegedly sold a misbranded drug due to a false or misleading medication name placed on the dispensed medication bottle. Patient allegedly was dispensed a prescription for lansoprazole 15mg capsules that contained lansoprazole 15mg/5ml suspension. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 217.065 (1). **CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.**

Case 16-0523 B. Pharmacist allegedly engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct by engaging in conduct likely to harm the public with or without established proof of actual injury by placing a false or misleading medication name on the dispensed medication bottle. Patient allegedly was dispensed a prescription for lansoprazole 15mg capsules that contained lansoprazole 15mg/5ml suspension. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (2) (d). **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and \$500 administrative fine, additional 6 hours of continuing education on pharmacy law.**

Case 17-0001. Registered Pharmacy Technician engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct due to diverting money from the cash register. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121 (1) (a). **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and revocation.**

Case 17-0045. Pharmacist allegedly violated her Agreed Order of Reinstatement by violating the Monitoring Agreement with the Kentucky Pharmacist Recovery Network (KYPRN) by not calling each day to ascertain if she was chosen for a drug screen. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(1)(i). **CRC Recommendation: There is sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the Executive Director is directed to attempt resolution through an Agreed Order and/or, if unsuccessful, to proceed with either an Administrative Conference, if requested, or the issuance of a Formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Standard terms and \$300 administrative fine.**

Case 17-0046. Pharmacist allegedly violated his Agreed Order of Reinstatement by violating the Monitoring Agreement with the Kentucky Pharmacist Recovery Network (KYPRN) by not calling each day to ascertain if he was chosen for a drug screen. Warning letter sent with information of a fine per missed call for future occurrences.**

Case 17-0047. Pharmacist allegedly violated his Agreed Order of Reinstatement by violating the Monitoring Agreement with the Kentucky Pharmacist Recovery Network (KYPRN) by not calling each day to ascertain if he was chosen for a drug screen. CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Case 17-0196. Pharmacist was allegedly convicted of a violation of pharmacy or drug laws, rules or administrative regulations of another state. Alleged Violation of Law: KRS 315.121(1)(c)3.
CRC Recommendation: There is insufficient evidence of a violation to warrant disciplinary action and the case is closed without prejudice.

Dr. Martin seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

RECIPROCITY/RELICENSURE/INTERNSHIP/PHARMACY TECHNICIAN

Pharmacy Technician Registrant, Case 17-0219. Dr. Dewire moved to approve a new application for pharmacy technician registration provided applicant signs an Agreed Order with standard KYPRN language that includes 3 years probation, up to 6 drug screens per year and 8 AA meetings per month. Ms. Brewer seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Pharmacy Technician Registrant, Case 17-0220. Dr. Martin moved to approve a renewal application for pharmacy technician registration with no restrictions. Mr. Poole seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE/COMMUNICATION

Carol Hornback - Compounding Equipment and Sink Waiver. Ms. Hornback requested a waiver of compounding equipment and sink waiver for Lincoln Trail Behavioral Health System. Dr. Martin moved to approve the waiver for compounding equipment but deny the waiver of a sink. Mr. Poole seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Richard Welch - Compounding Equipment Waiver. Dr. Welch requested a waiver of compounding equipment for Doctors RX. Dr. Dewire moved to approve the waiver for compounding equipment. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

NABP

President Greenwell announced that Ms. Katie Busroe will receive the John F. Atkinson Service Award at the NABP Annual meeting in Orlando, FL. Recipients of the John F. Atkinson Service Award are individuals who have provided NABP with exemplary service in protecting the public health and have shown significant involvement with the Association related to pharmacy law and compliance. This award was named in honor of former NABP general counsel John F. Atkinson who served the Association for more than 40 years.

Reggie Dillard. The Board received notice from Reggie Dillard, Executive Director of the Tennessee Board of Pharmacy, of his candidacy for election of the District III position of the NABP Executive Committee.

LEGISLATION/REGULATION

Ms. Busroe updated the Board on bills currently up for review in this Legislative session.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Dr. Martin moved to approve continuing education programs 17-05, 17-07 through 17-10 and deny the continuing education program 17-06. The reason for the denial of 17-06 is that it is nearly the yearly CE requirement for renewal and is not applicable to Kentucky practice. Dr. Dewire seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

201 KAR 2:380. Mr. Poole moved to table this discussion until the May Board Meeting and add it to the agenda for the afternoon work session. Dr. Martin seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

201 KAR 2:074. Dr. Hanna moved to approve this regulation as written. Mr. Poole seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Dr. Martin moved to file this regulation by March 15, 2017 and set a Hearing date of April 24, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. Dr. Hanna seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

DEA 106 2016 and 2017 Report. Austin Little and Kirill Braginsky, pharmacist interns on rotation at the Kentucky Board of Pharmacy, presented findings of the DEA 106 Theft or Loss of Controlled Substances forms from 2016 - 2017. Dr. Hanna moved to direct Board staff to create a statistical baseline of DEA 106 Theft or Loss of Controlled Substances forms submitted to the Board office from 2014 to present. Dr. Martin seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

FYI

Ms. Busroe informed the Board that a request was received to expunge prior disciplinary actions. This action meets the requirements of 201 KAR 2:270.

ADJOURNMENT

Dr. Hanna moved to adjourn. Mr. Poole seconded, the motion passed unanimously. President Greenwell adjourned the meeting at 11:48 a.m. The next regularly scheduled meeting begins at 9 a.m. on May 10, 2017 at the Board Office in Frankfort, Kentucky.
