MINUTES

Chair Matt Martin called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. Members present: Barb Jolley, Paul Daniels, Chris Harlow and Trenika Mitchell. Members absent: Alyson Roby, John Carver and Jennifer Grove. Staff: Larry Hadley, Cheryl Lalonde, Katie Busroe, Amanda Harding, Jessica Williams, Rhonda Hamilton, John Romine and Darla Sayre. Dr. Martin informed the committee and audience that the purpose of this committee was to propose regulation to the Kentucky Board of Pharmacy based on the pending adoption of <USP> 800 in 2019. Regulation would consist of total compliance with <USP> 800, partial compliance with <USP> 800 or alternative regulations written by the committee. These regulations should protect employees and the public without becoming a burden for facility compliance.

Ms. Lalonde expressed concerns regarding the length of a proposed regulation. Current administration is recommending Boards to update current regulations removing those that are now obsolete. Based on her attendance at FARB 2018, she advised that FTC would be less likely to take action against a Board who has adopted federal regulations rather than proposing their own state based regulation.

After much discussion, the committee set the following dates and agendas for upcoming meetings:

March 12, 2018	Sections 1,2,3,4,8 and 9 of <USP> 800
April 9, 2018	Manufactured Products
May 14, 2018	To be determined at the March meeting
June 11, 2018	To be determined at the April meeting

Meetings will be held at the Board office in Frankfort, KY. The committee will go thru <USP> 800 section by section then topically to determine if compliance to the proposed <USP> 800 is the best alternative. Interested parties can address concerns at the meeting. The committee will determine if these concerns can be addressed with a Board approved waiver.

Board staff will provide a list of guidelines of <USP> 800 regarding mandatory verses discretionary at the next committee meeting.

On motion by Dr. Harlow, seconded by Dr. Mitchell and passed unanimously, Dr. Martin adjourned at 11:38 p.m.
