**MINUTES**

Peter P. Cohron, Chair called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m.

On motion by Mr. Parks, seconded by Mr. Hurt and passed unanimously, the minutes from the April 25, 2018 were approved. Trent Blacketer joined the meeting at 1:26 p.m.

Ms. Lalonde presented the draft of KAR 2:370 with the proposed changes from the April 25, 2018 meeting. Additional changes were proposed. On motion by Mr. Hurt, seconded by Mr. Parks and passed unanimously, these changes were approved. Dr. Cohron directed Ms. Lalonde to revise the draft of 201 KAR 2:370 with these changes and present it at the next meeting.

Ms. Busroe and Ms. Harding are scheduled to meet with the Cabinet for Health and Family Services regarding vetting of personal care facilities. They will report their findings at the next meeting.

After much discussion, the committee will consider expanding this regulation to include a more comprehensive use of an automated dispensing system with the possibility of requiring licensure by the Board for such devices. Ms. York will provide DEA policy for automated dispensing systems at the next meeting. Mr. Blacketer will provide the laws and regulations from other states regarding this issue at the next meeting.

The next meeting will be held at the Board office in Frankfort at 1:00 p.m. on May 16, 2018.
